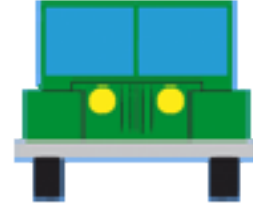

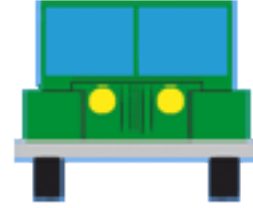

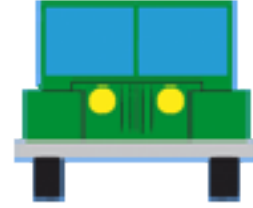

## Round 6: Animals Adaptations

1. Polar bears have white fur because it provides camouflage in the snow but what colour is their skin?  
*Black*
2. Why do camels have fur in their ears?  
*Stop sand getting in.*
3. Why do cheetahs unlike other cat species have non-retractable claws?  
*Provide grip as they run at fast speeds, stops them falling over*
4. Why do giraffes have blue/black tongues?  
*Stops it getting sunburnt in the hot African sun*
5. Why do lions have loose bellies?  
*For protection, allows them to be kicked by prey with little injury*
6. Why do both male and female African elephants have tusks?  
*Tusks are to uprooting tree, strip bark and digging up roots, water and salt.*
7. What physical adaptation is seen in the Fennec fox that allows him to keep calm and alert of predators?  
*Very large ears*
8. Why are penguins black on their backs and white on their bellies?  
*When a predator approaches from below, it can not easily distinguish between the white belly and the colour of the sky. In converse, if the predator approaches from above, it will only see the darkness of the deep blue sea. The black also helps absorb sun light.*
9. Why are the black and white stripes of a Zebra a good form of Camouflage?  
*The zebra's stripes act as camouflage as they break up the outline of the zebra's body making it difficult to see them from far away. Also when zebras are grouped together, their stripes merge together which confused the predator and it hard for them to pick an individual out.*
9. How are the mouths of pythons adapted to swallow large prey?  
*Pythons are able to swallow their prey whole because of their hinged jaws. These jaws separate and this allow them to intake an "object four to five times as wide as its head".*
